International TOVS Working Group

- Established in 1983 as a working group of the International Radiation Commission (IRC).
- Adopted in 2012 as sub-group of the Coordination Group for Meteorological Satellites (CGMS).
- Provides a forum where operational and research users of atmospheric infrared and microwave sounder data exchange information on:
 - Sensor and satellite status (particularly for new missions)
 - Processing methods and derived products (temperature, water vapor, trace gases...)
 - Sounder data use in Data Assimilation and Numerical Weather Prediction
 - Radiative transfer and surface properties
 - Climate studies
 - Real time sounder data reception, processing, and product



International TOVS Working Group

• ITWG = International TOVS Working Group

• TOVS = TIROS Operational Vertical Sounders

• TIROS = Television Infra-Red Observation Satellites



International TOVS Study Conference

- ITSC is held every 18-24 months; 24 conferences have been held since 1983.
- ITSC-24 was held in person in Tromsø, Norway, in March 2023
 162 participants, 78 oral presentations, 92 posters, 17 NWP centre reports
- In-person conference spans 7 days:
 - 5 days are plenary session talks and posters (single track)
 - 1 day is for working group meetings
 - 1 day free
- Working groups meet for 2-4 hours to discuss progress on action items, new topics, and assign new actions and recommendations.
- Working group co-chairs present and write up a working group report.
- ITWG co-chairs present Recommendations to CGMS and IRC.


WORKING GROUP

The future infrared sounder (IRS)

- Will be on board the future European geostationary satellite MTG (2024)
- Will be able to measure radiance at the top of the atmosphere using 1960 channels in the infrared between 680-1210 cm⁻¹ and 1600-2250 cm⁻¹
- The IRS observations will provide information on atmospheric temperature and humidity, surfaces, winds, chemical composition of the atmosphere over Europe with high temporal frequency (**30 minutes**) and fine horizontal resolution (**4x7 km**)

Objectives


- * Preparation of the assimilation of IRS for AROME
- * Assessing the impact of IRS in the full system
- To be ready to assimilate real IRS data from day one!





Part 1 : 1D study – IRS analysis & selection of information

Creation of 1D database & sensitivity analysis




- 7500 synthetic IRS observations & background profiles
- IRS Sensitivity analysis



General IRS channel selection for NWP


- Use of the information content method (Degree of Freedom for Signal) \rightarrow DFS = Tr (I- AB^{-1})
- 1D-Var selection testing with 1700 profiles & 300 IRS channel selection


IRS Observation-errors


- Observation errors matrix from the converted NEΔT(T) for the corresponding scene temperature T for each pixel
- Use of 1D-Var data assimilation & Statistical estimation of the full R matrix using the Desroziers method



Principal component study

• Testing the conversion of raw radiances into principal components and then into reconstructed radiances from the new calculation grid (1960 channels for 300 PCs)







Scheme of OSSE framework for AROME 3D-Var data assimilation system



Relative Forecast scores (RMS - Summer - 2 month)









Recommendation from the Radiative Transfer and Surface Properties WG

Spectroscopy

Recommendation RTSP-5 to Spectroscopy Community
 A strong emphasis should be put on the continuous support of
 theoretical and laboratory spectroscopic studies. It is crucial that a
 compilation of basic line parameters is maintained. In this regard, it is
 recommended to work more closely with the planetary/ astronomy
 community for knowledge of LBL / spectroscopy information.



Example of WG outcomes

Aerosols

- It was discussed that the RTTOV OPAC/CAMS database now includes the following species: volcanic ash, Asian dust and the ICON-ARTS species. There is concern by RTTOV developers that there are many users, but they do not know who they are nor their needs.
- Recommendation RTSP-6 Reach out to the aerosol community and survey their aerosol (physical) needs
- Recommendation RTSP-7 to aerosol community The group encourages the publication of a literature review that includes new aerosol studies and challenges regarding VIS/near-IR aerosol sensitivities and spectral dependencies
- Recommendation RTSP-8 to aerosol community The group continually supports field campaigns and the community to use field campaign data for validation studies. The group further recommends to connect aerosol FCs to RT evaluation


