Context

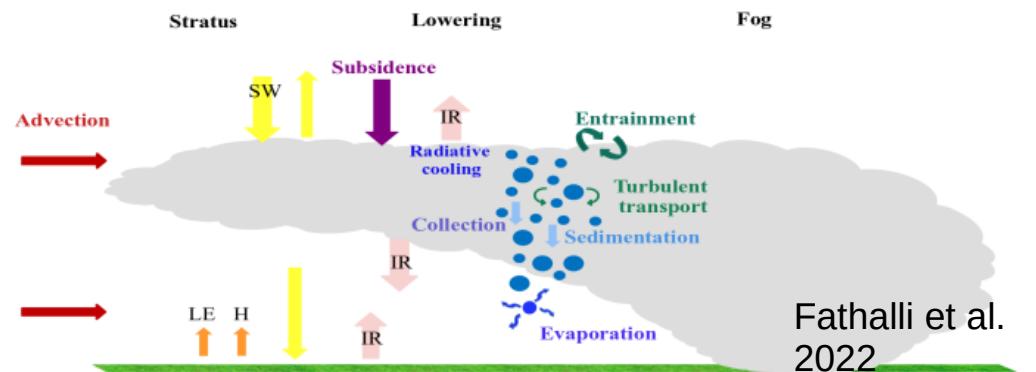
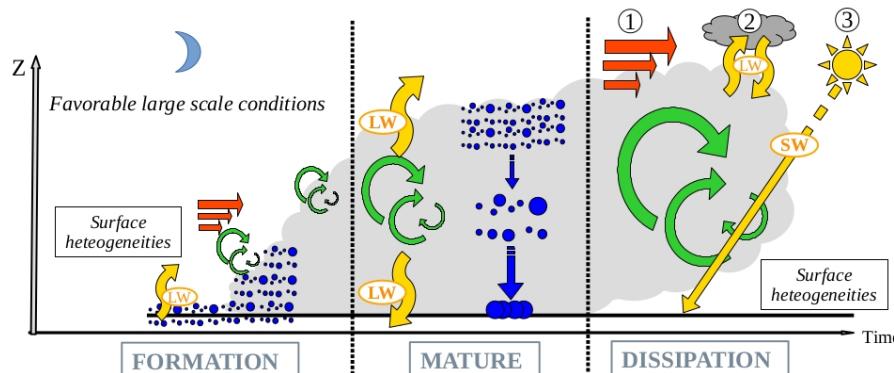


- High **economical impact of fog on transport** :
a specific research action started at Météo France for 5 years (COP 2017-2021)
=> Development of a high resolution version of the NWP model AROME-500m
- **SOFOG3D field experiment & ANR project**
 - Evaluation/validation of AROME-500m
 - improve our understanding of fog **processes to derive refined parameterizations** :
=> 3D high resolution LES simulations & experimental studies
 - new data assimilation tests

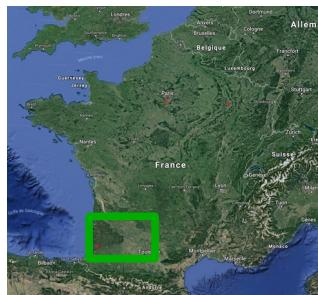
Objective and main scientific questions

- Provide a **3D characterization of fog layer properties** with detailed observations of dynamics, radiation, microphysics and surface fluxes
- Processes study using **synergy between 3D high-resolution LES and detailed observations**
 - Dynamics : **impact of surface heterogeneities** on the spatio-temporal variability of the fog ?
 - Microphysics : **transition between thin and thick fog**, impact of aerosols ?
 - Stratus to fog transition** : microphysics and local processes vs large scale conditions ?
- Data assimilation of local observations** : **microwave radiometer (MWR) network & radar 95GHz**
- ANR funding : 5 years project (2018-2023)



SOFOG3D Experimental strategy

- 6 month experiment : Fall-winter 2019-2020
- 3 nested domains



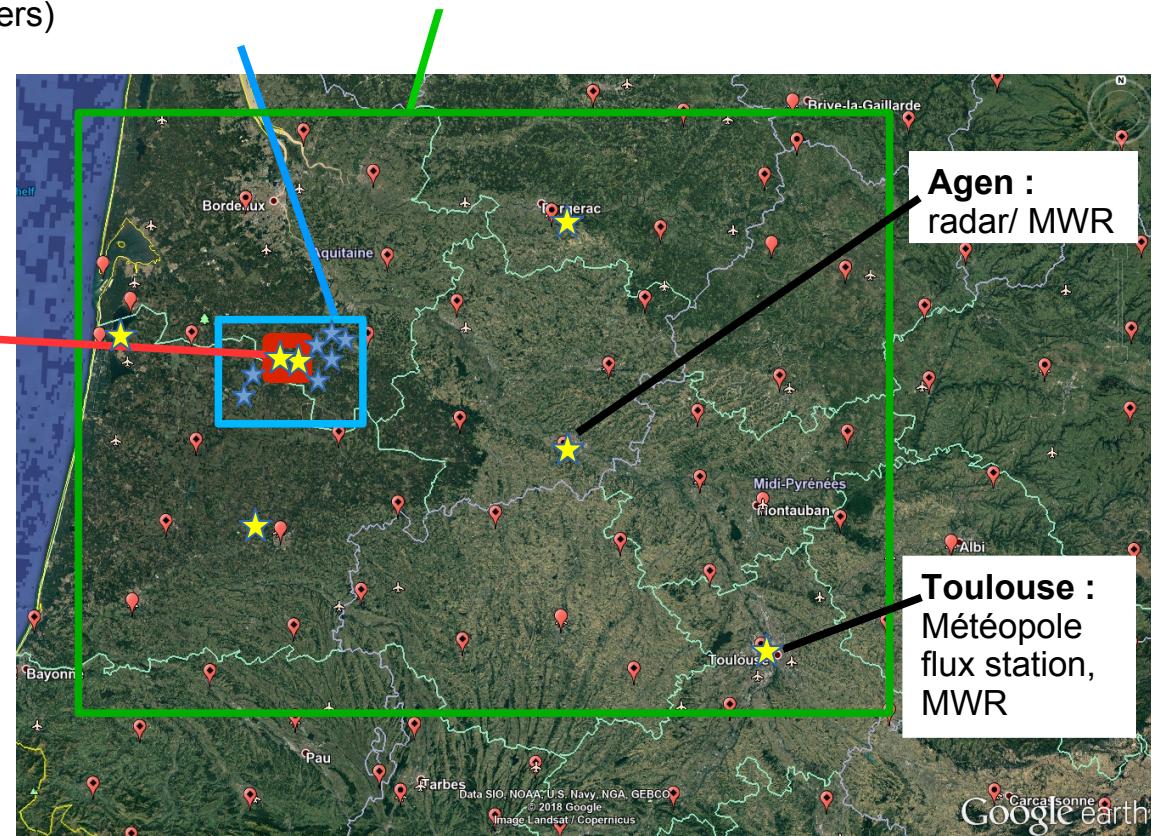
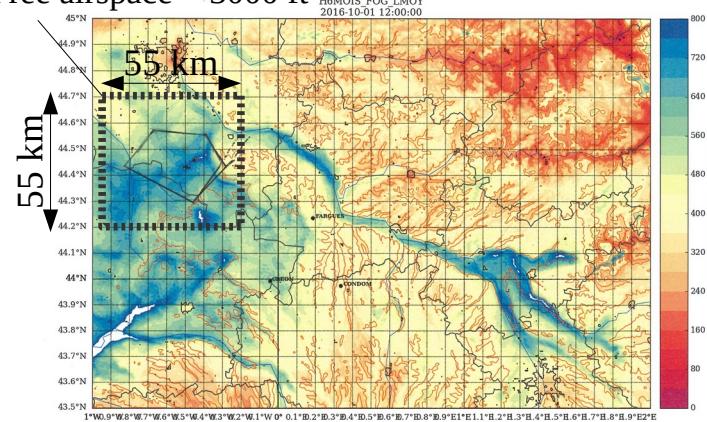
Surrounding domain 50 x 30 km
with increased density in-situ sensors network (+7 surface met. stations, visibility, +2 ceilometers)

Larger domain 300 x 200 km (AROME-500m model)
with in-situ sensors (~ 50 surface meteor. stations) and MWR (6 sites) networks

Super-site 10 x 6 km:

- radar/MWR/lidars
- tethered balloon ; UAVs fleet
- 10 met. stations ; 50 m mast (2)
- sites with **different vegetation types**: heat and turbulent fluxes, radiation budget, aerosol and fog microphysics, water deposition, visibility, 3 ceilometers

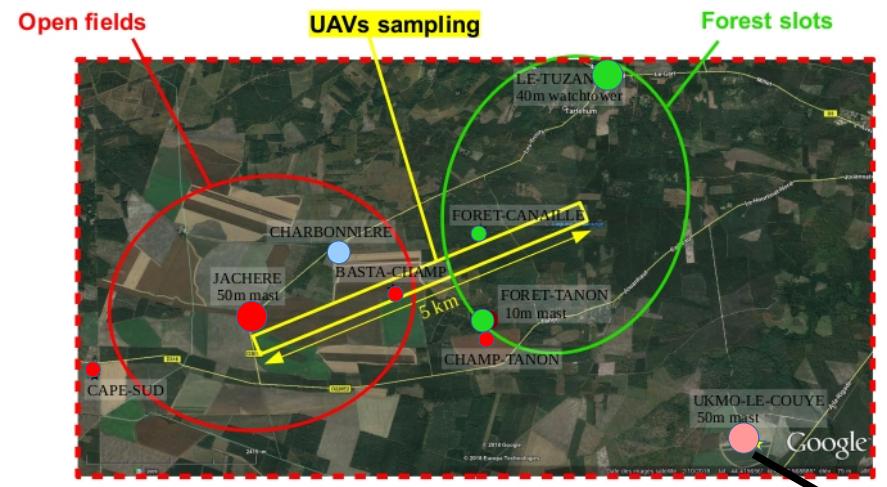
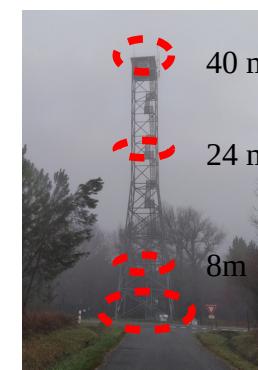
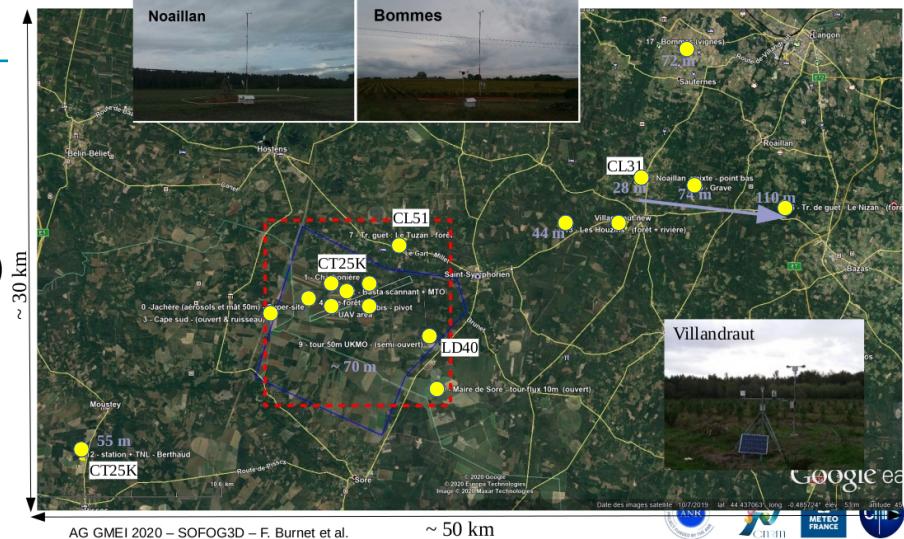


Observational set-up

- Surface network => **contrast open fields / pine forest**
 - 17 stations with 2 50m-masts
- Combine remote sensing (radar, MWR, lidar, ceilometer,...) and in situ (fluxes, aerosols, microphysics,...)
- Automatic systems and IOP triggered on forecasts :
 - tethered balloon, RS and UAV

SOFOG3D surrounding domain : 7 sites (+ 10 super-site)

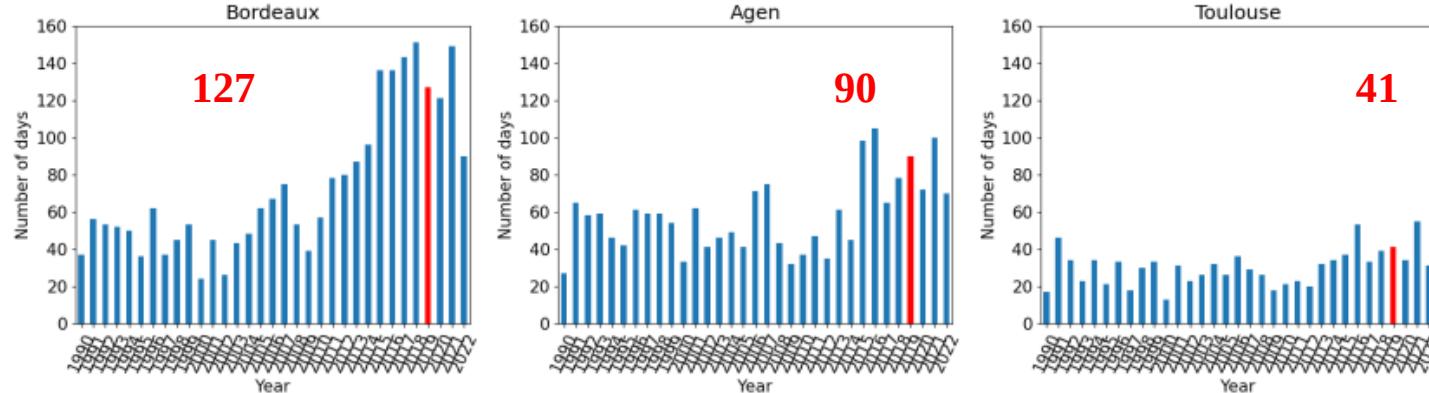

- Number of foggy days per autumn-winter (Sept.-March) since 1990 :

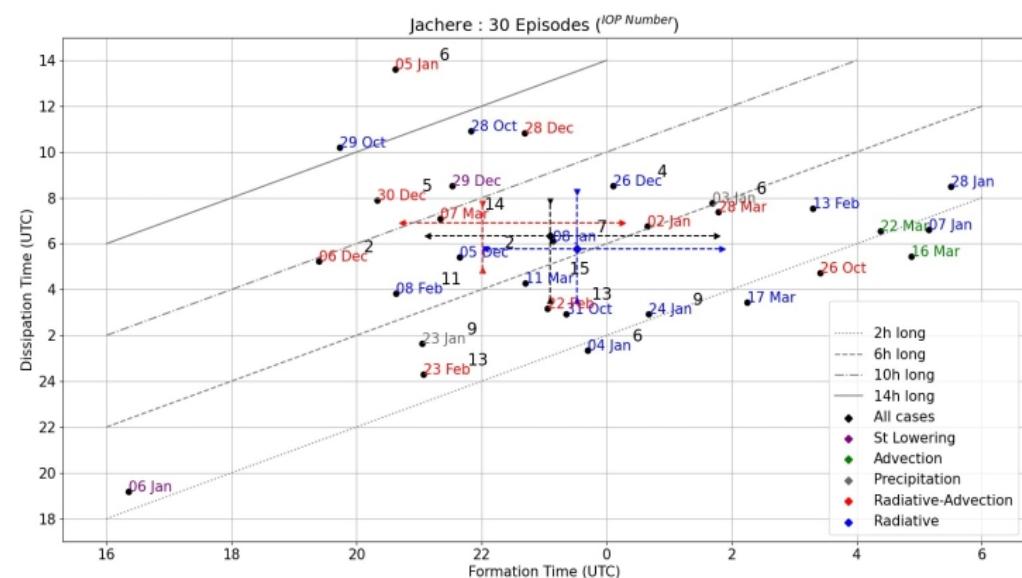
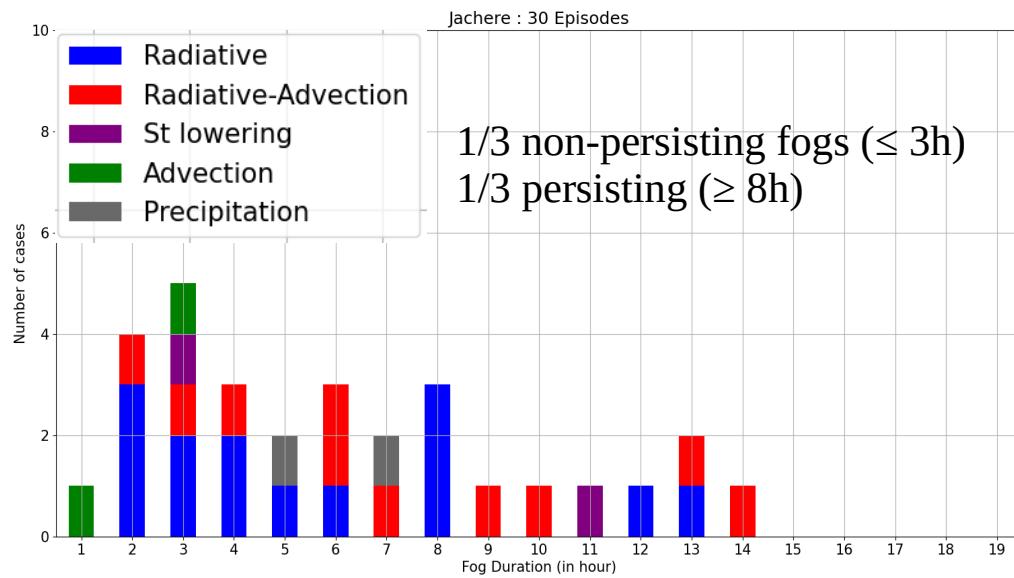

- 30 fog events at the super site (less than expected)

- 14 radiation and 10 radiation-advection
- 2 advection, 2 St lowering and 2 precipitation

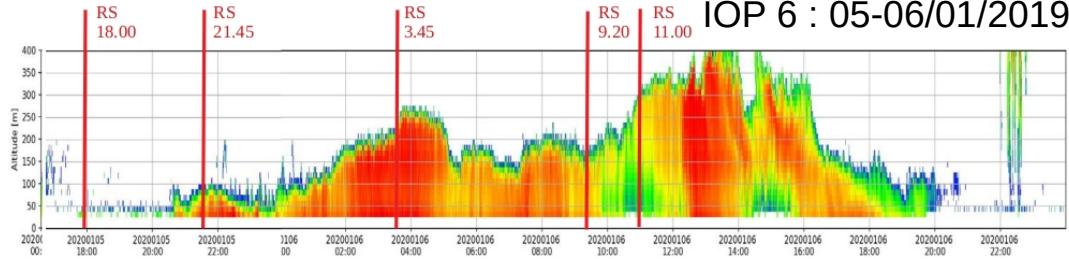
- Fog forms and dissipates at anytime during the night



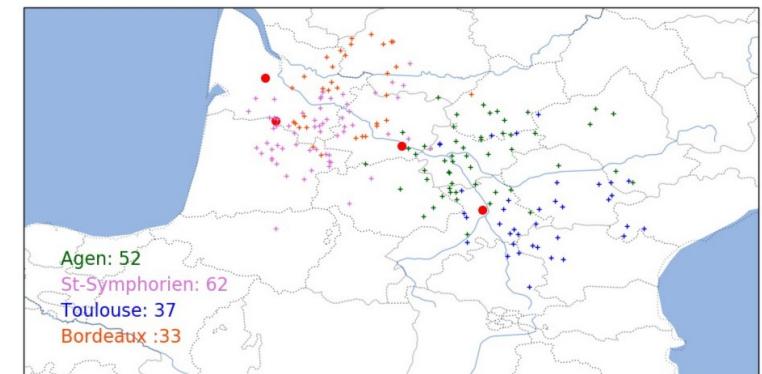
IOP overview : 01/12/2019 => 12/03/2020

- **15 IOP => 20 nights of tethered balloon operations + RS:**
 - 5 without fog (or just mist)
 - 8 thin fogs with width $H \leq 50$ m
 - 4 medium with $80 \leq H \leq 180$ m
 - 3 thick $H \geq 200$ m : **IOP-6, 11 and 14**

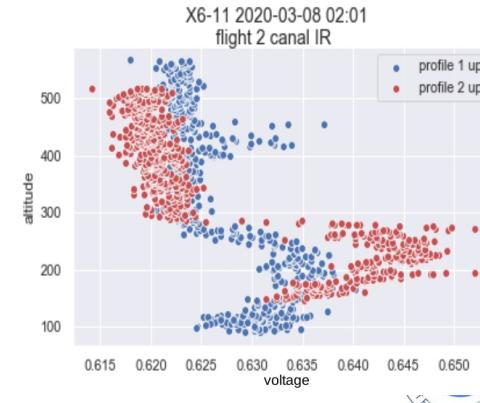
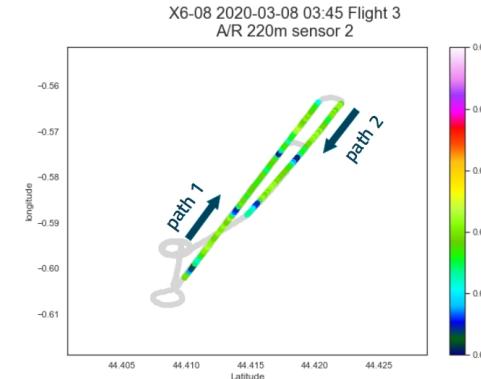
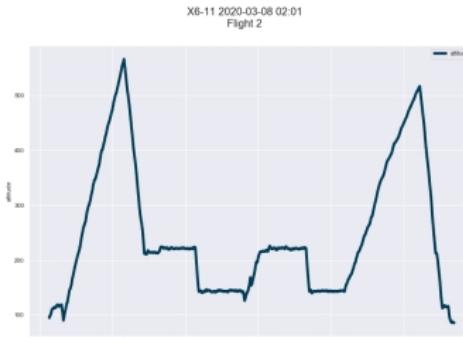

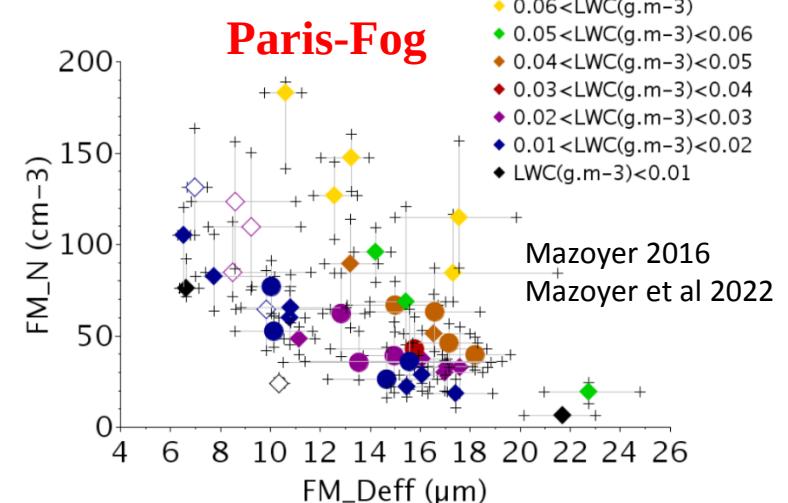
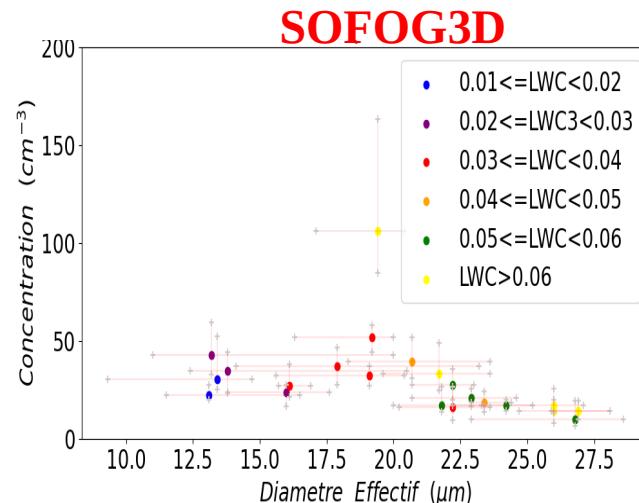


- **7 IOP with UAV flights - 5 km legs**

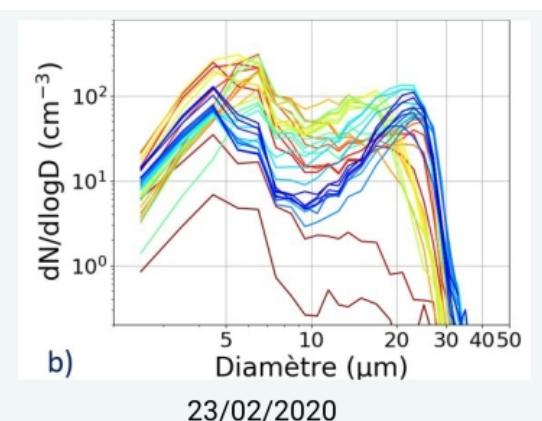
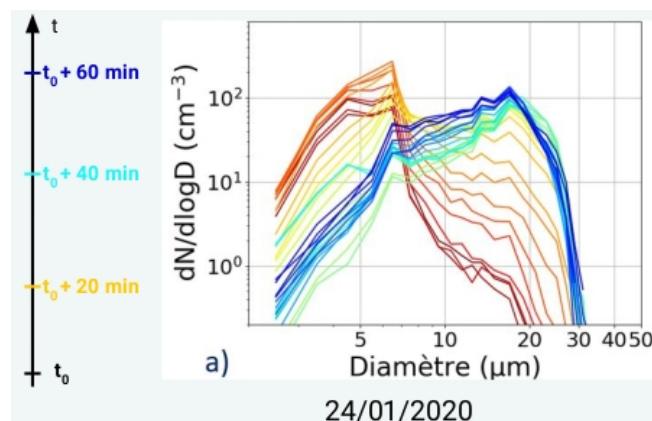


Microphysics properties :

- FM120 measurements at Jachère site : low CDNC (< 50 cm⁻³) of large droplets

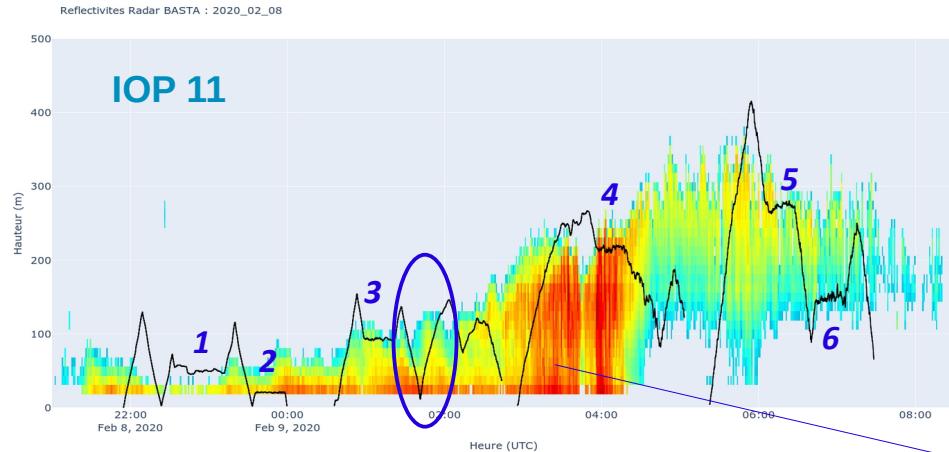


Many bimodal droplet size distributions

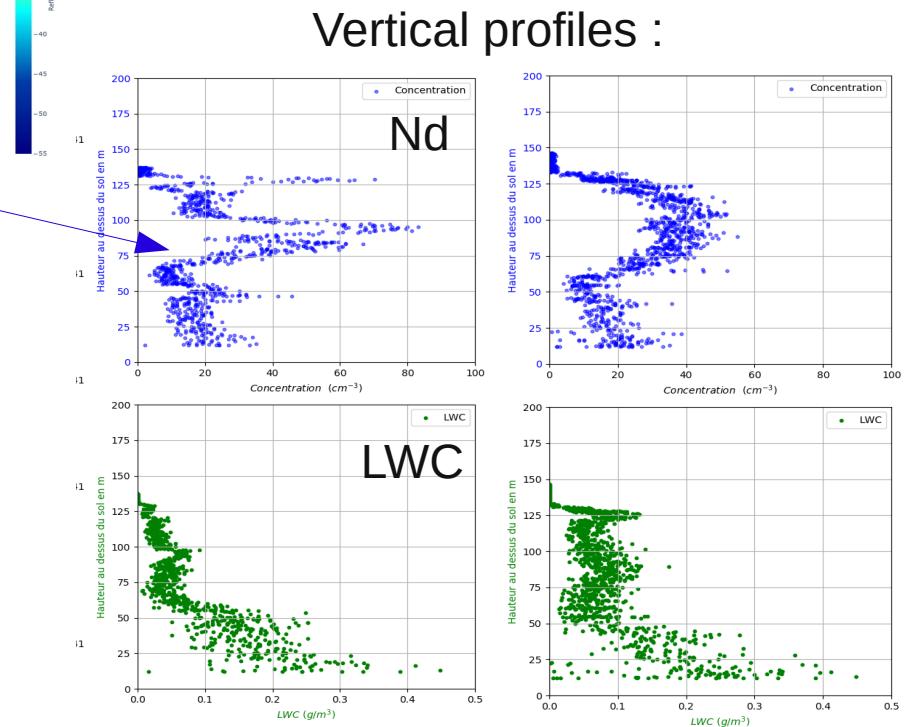
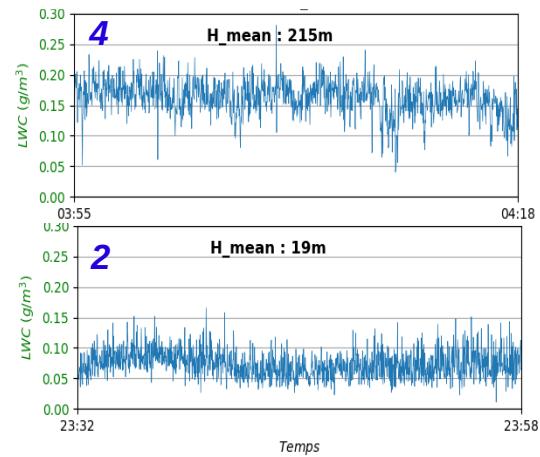


Vertical profiles of fog microphysics

- CDP below tethered balloon : contrast constant leg / profiles



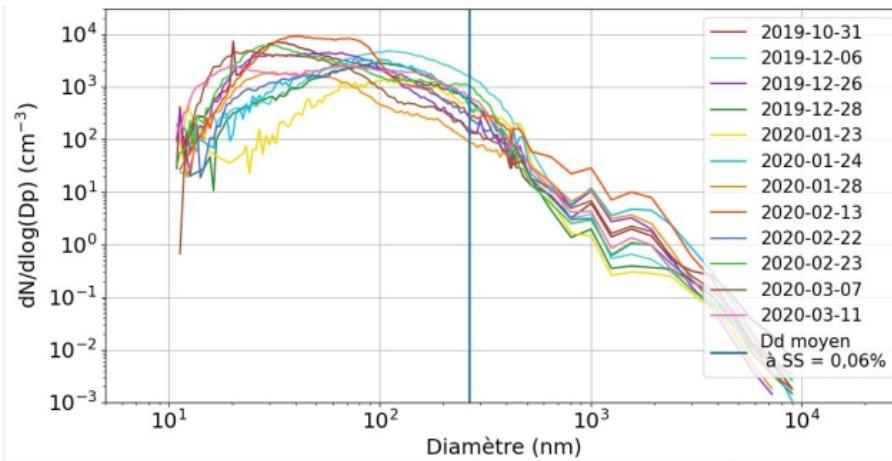
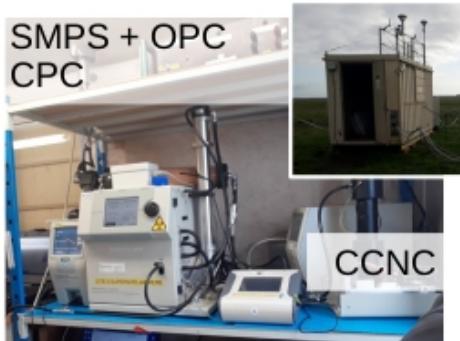
Constant altitude leg

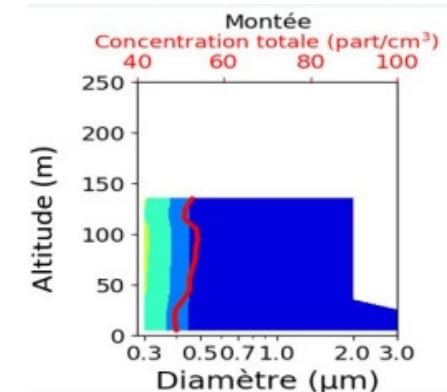
Impact of aerosols :

- **Microphysics, radiatives and hygroscopic properties of aerosols**
 - low concentration ($N_a \sim 2500 \text{ cm}^{-3}$)
 - $0.19 < \kappa < 0.38 \Rightarrow$ impact of organics



Vertical variability

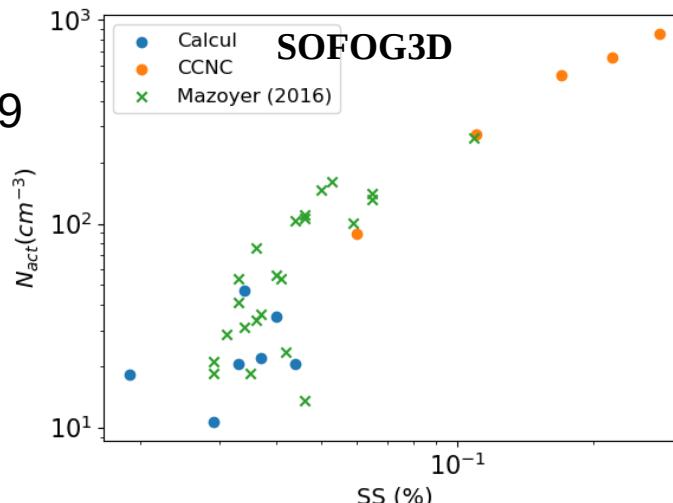
OPC below tethered balloon before fog event

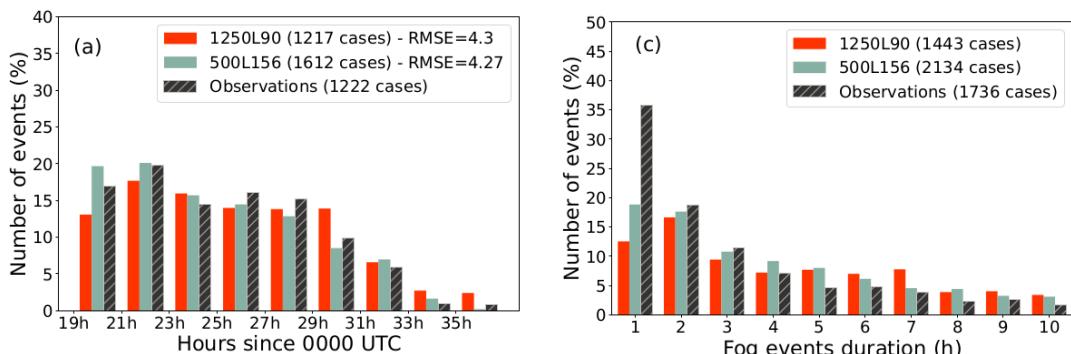

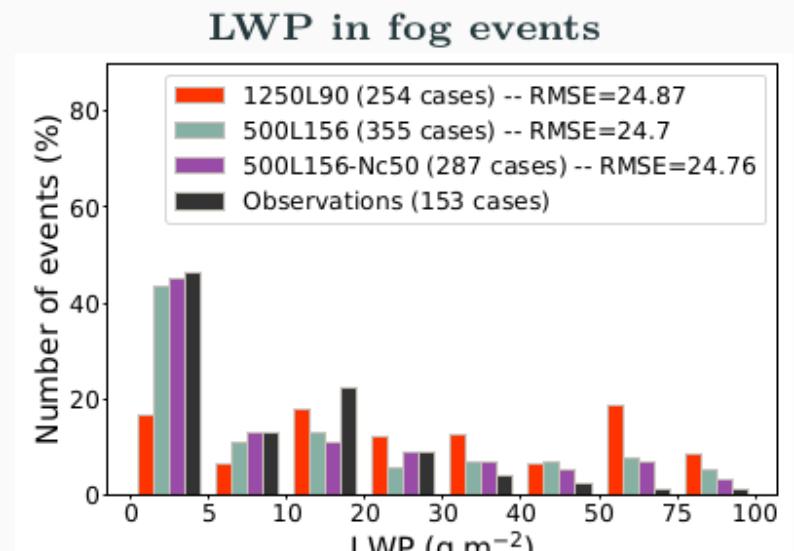
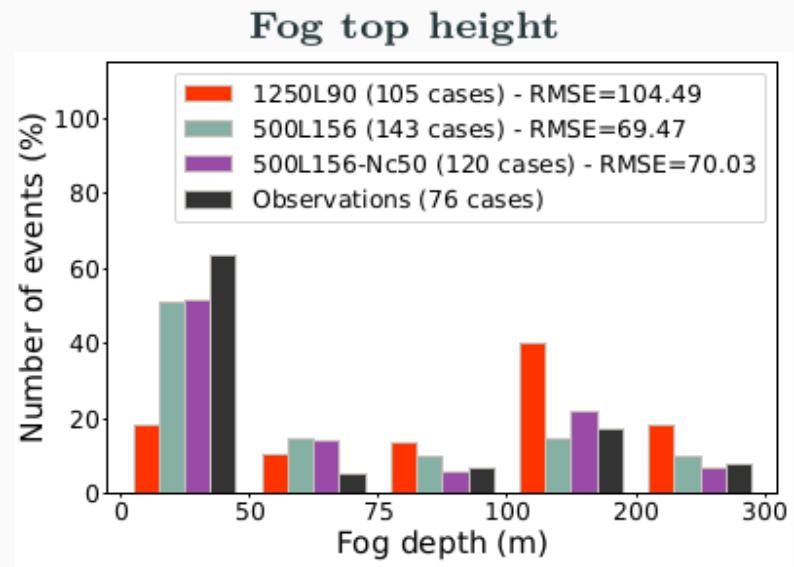

- Simulations at 0h UTC for 48h every day
- Over all sites for the entire night (+18 to +36h) :
 - Increase of the detection rate 63 vs **74** %
 - but also of the false alarm rate 35 vs **44** %
- more fog with low LWP and thin layer
- less fog with high LWP and thick layer
- linked to reduced CDNC values
- Reduction of the fog formation delay (turbulence)

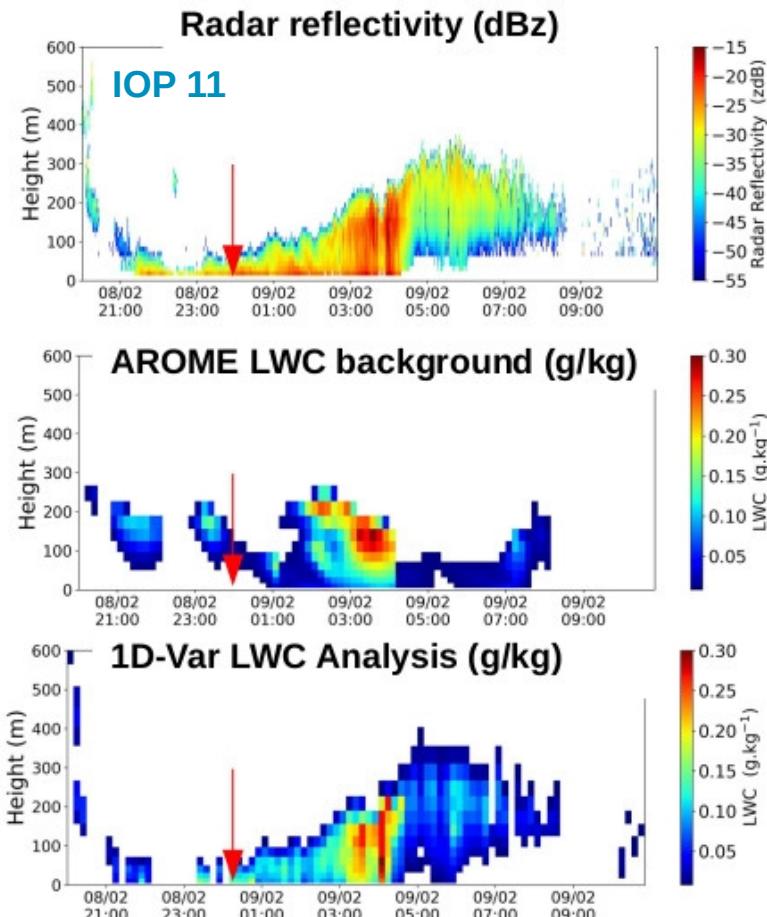


New data assimilation in AROME

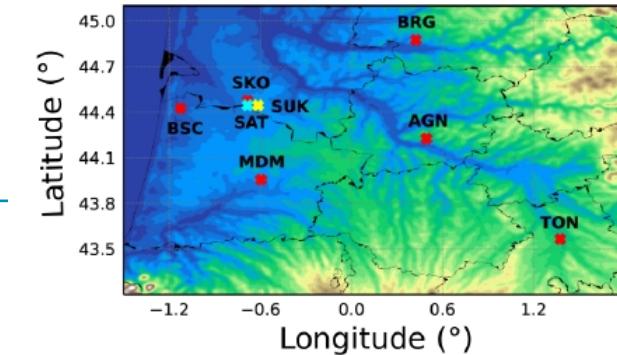
- **3D-Var assimilation of MWR temperature profiles :**

- 8 MWRs deployed at 6 sites (Martinet et al. 2022)
- **significant improvement of the temperature profiles bias** in the first 2 km of altitude and for several hours (Thomas et al. 2023 in prep.)

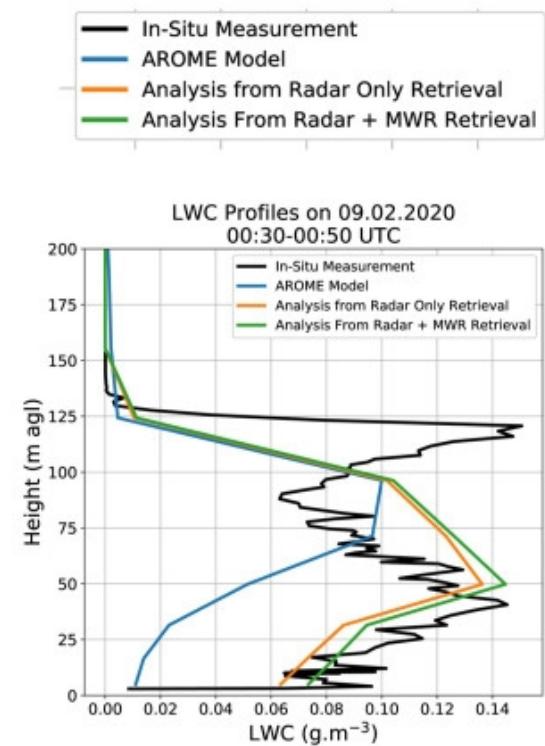
- **1D-Var assimilation of combined cloud radar Z and MWR BT**



- Significant temporal and fog top heights errors in the AROME background profiles (nearest in time).
- 1D-Var retrievals much more **consistent** with the observed fog structures compared to the BASTA cloud radar.
- Good agreement between 1D-Var retrievals and in-situ CDP measurements

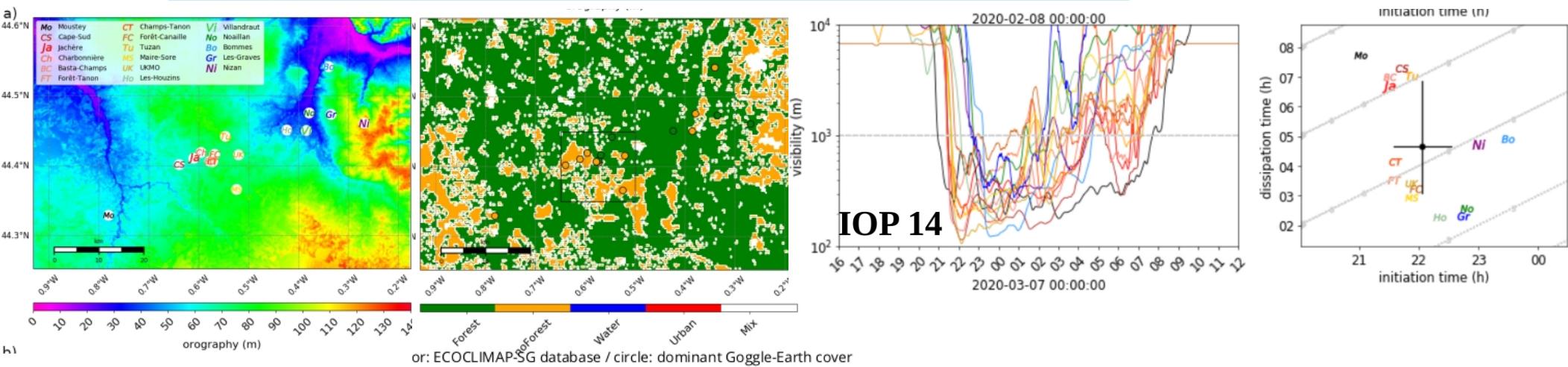

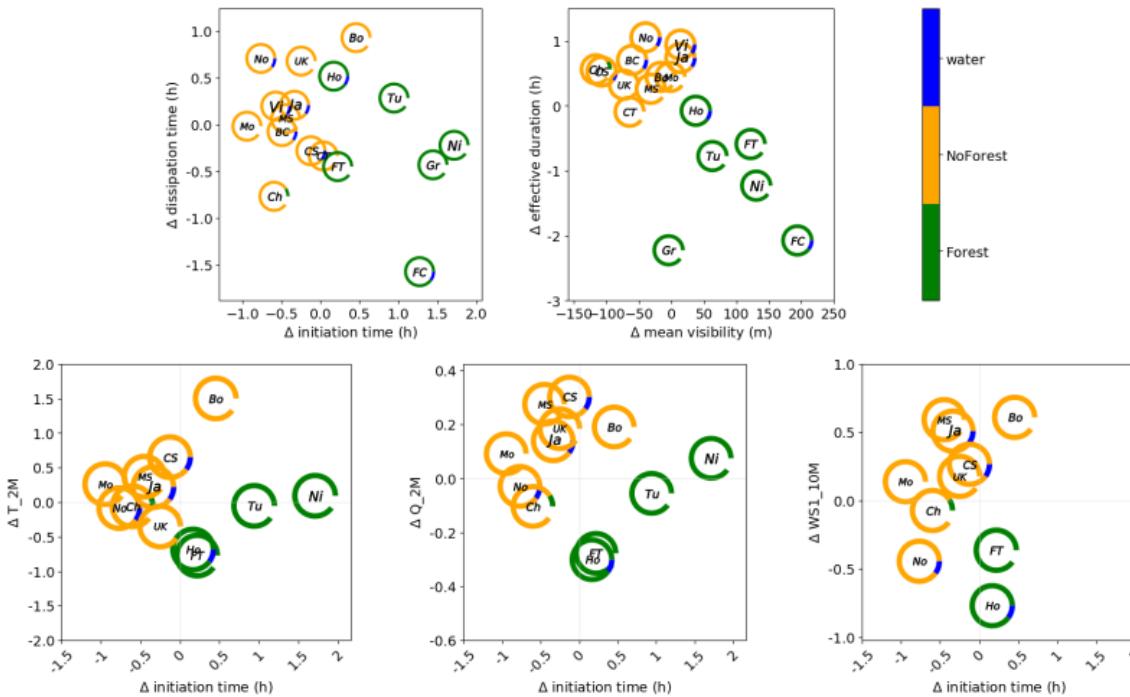


Impact of surface heterogeneities

Comparison between forest and non-forest sites from the whole measurement database



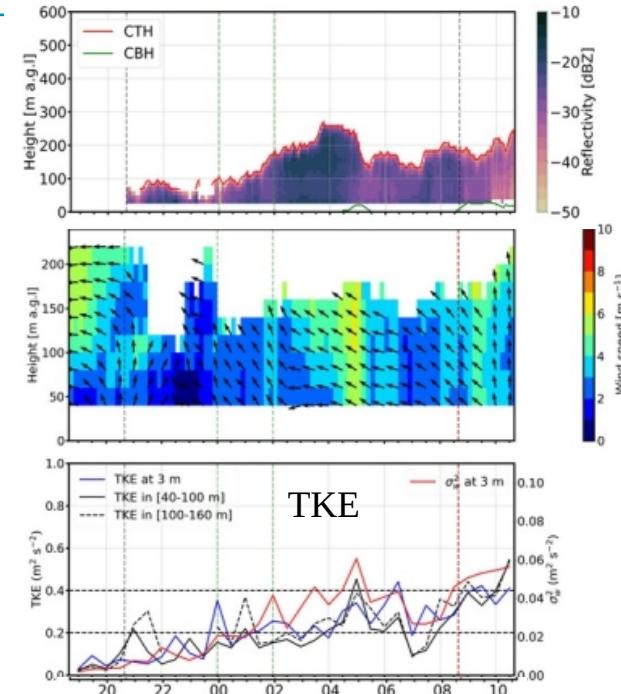
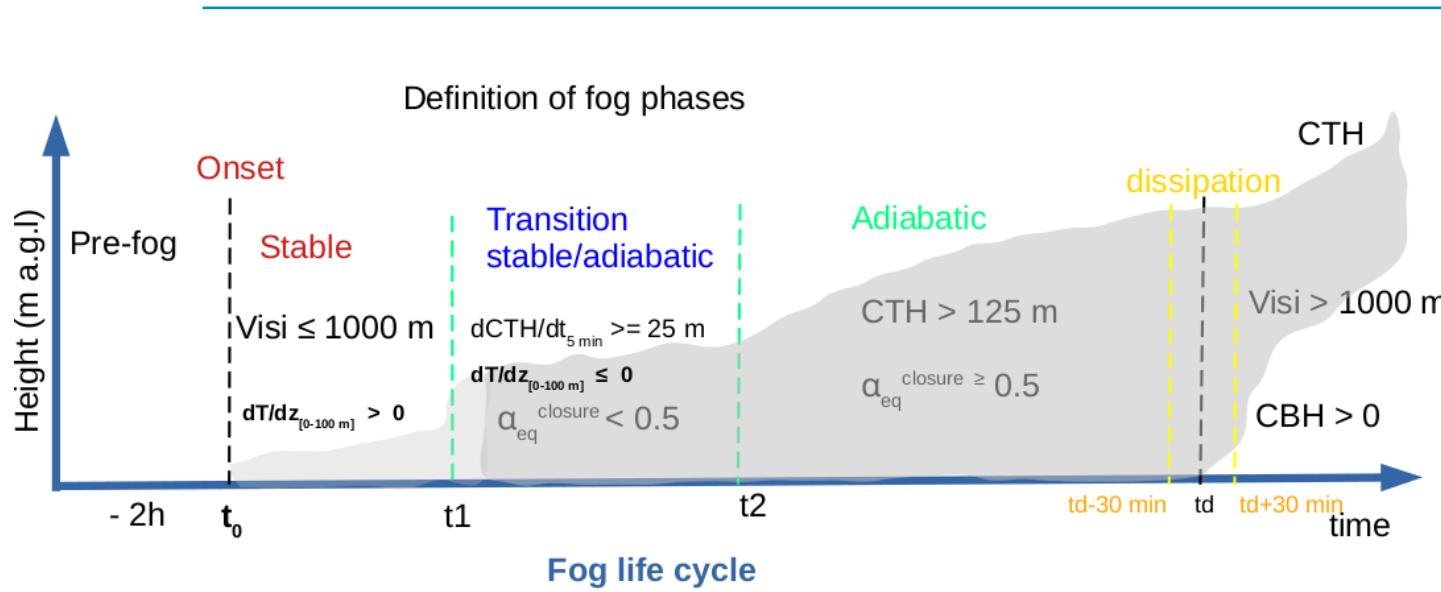
- Delayed initiation on forest sites
- No impact of ground cover during dissipation
- Shorter fog durations in forest
- Higher visibilities (3m) in the forest
- Lower temperatures, humidities and wind speeds at the forest sites during the three hours preceding the fog formation

9th Figure: Average deviation from the mean state during each fog episode at the different sites represented by their initials.
The pie chart surrounding each initial represents the vegetation cover distribution within a 100m radius around the



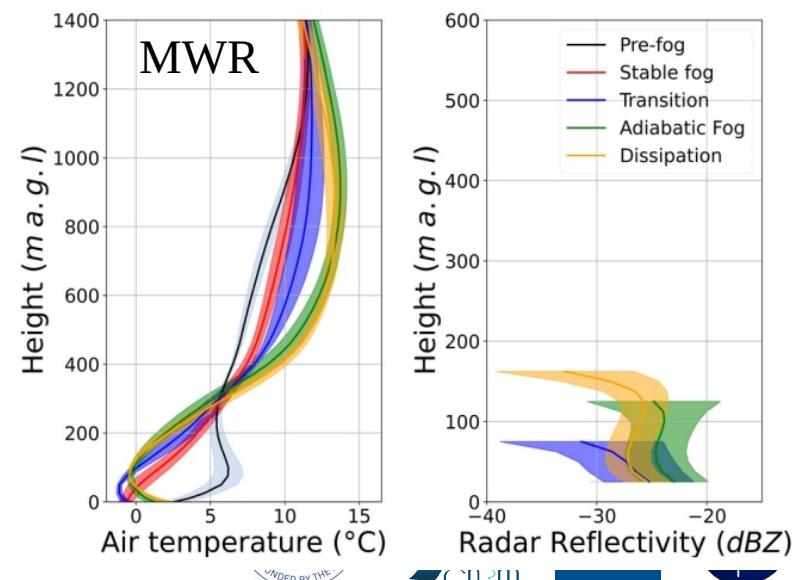
Role of thermodynamics and turbulence

IOP 6

- Analysis of the 4 deepest fogs from remote sensing
 - radar, MWR, wind lidar and ceilometer
- Longer duration for stronger temperature inversion
- Thin to thick transition :
 - TKE increases to $0.2\text{-}0.4\text{ m}^2\text{s}^{-2}$
- Dissipation : $TKE > 0.4\text{ m}^2\text{s}^{-2}$
mechanical for nighttime, thermal for daytime
- Nowcasting with the adiabatic conceptual model
